- \$27.98 Billion in Net Revenue in 2014
- 2.70 Billion Units Sold in 2014
- Trade Book Market was \$15.43 billion in 2014
- 2.42 Billion Units Sold in 2014



- The area of largest growth for the trade category was children and young adult, which had double-digit growth in both revenue (20.9%) and units (13.5%).
- Children and young adult fiction surpassed the adult fiction market with 843 million units and 746 million units sold respectively.

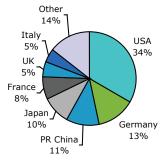
- 9,634 attendees came from 50 states and 68 countries
